THE SECOND LESSON Romans 8:1-11

¹There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. ²For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. ³For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do: by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and to deal with sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴so that the just requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. ⁵For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit. ⁶To set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. ⁷For this reason the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law—indeed it cannot, ⁸and those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

THE SERMON

THE ORDER FOR HOLY BAPTISM (8:00 am)

The candidate, sponsors, and parents gather at the font.

■ In Holy Baptism our gracious heavenly Father liberates us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are born children of a fallen humanity; in the waters of Baptism we are reborn children of God and inheritors of eternal life. By water and the Holy Spirit we are made members of the Church which is the body of Christ. As we live with him and with his people, we grow in faith, love, and obedience to the will of God.

The sponsor presents the candidate.

Sponsor: I present Max Layton Tebbs to receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.

The pastor addresses the sponsor and parents.

■ In Christian love you have presented this child for Holy Baptism. You should, therefore, faithfully bring him to the services of God's house, and teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments. As he grows in years, you should place in his hands the Holy Scriptures and provide for his instruction in the Christian faith, that, living in the covenant of his Baptism and in communion with the Church, he may

lead a godly life until the day of Jesus Christ.

P Do you promise to fulfill these obligations?

Sponsor and Parents: I do.

THANKSGIVING

- **P** The Lord be with you.

To you be given praise and honor and worship through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The pastor addresses the baptismal group and the congregation.

- I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church, the faith in which we baptize.
- **P** Do you renounce all the forces of evil, the devil, and all his empty promises?
- **C** I do.
- **P** Do you believe in God the Father?
- **G** I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- **P** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

 I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

- **P** Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen

BAPTISM

The pastor baptizes the candidate.

- Max Layton is baptized in the name of the Father, *The pastor pours water on the candidate's head.*
- **P** and of the Son,

The pastor pours water on the candidate's head a second time.

P and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

The pastor pours water on the candidate's head a third time.

▶ Let us pray. God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, we give you thanks for freeing your sons and daughters from the power of sin and for raising them up to a new life through this holy sacrament. Pour your Holy Spirit upon Max: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence.

The pastor marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized. Oil prepared for this purpose may be used. As the sign of the cross is made, the pastor says:

- Max Layton, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

A lighted candle is given to the sponsor with these words:

P Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

Let us pray. O God, the giver of all life, look with kindness upon the father and mother of Max. Let them ever rejoice in the gift you have given them. Make them teachers and examples of righteousness for their child. Strengthen them in their own Baptism so they may share eternally with their son the salvation you have given them, through Jesus Christ our Lord.



LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF (LWR) UPDATE


We are starting to collect items for the kits that will be due at the end of September. Bags for the school kits will be available near the Sacristy/Handicap door on Sundays, starting in July.

There is a great need for the fabric kits and personal care kits, as well as the baby kits and, of course, the school kits. The fabric kits are used as a teaching tool to help provide income in some places. Please review the directions sheet for the kits.

We will not be collecting bulk soaps as LWR no longer accepts them. Please donate any extra soaps you have to Shepherd of the Streets.

Now is a great time to start collecting items: each time you go to the store pick up something for one of the kits. For those of you who do not want to do any kits, monetary donations are appreciated as it takes \$2.25 to ship a quilt, \$1.40 for a school kit, \$1.30 for the baby care kit, \$1.00 for a fabric kit, and \$2.65 for a personal care kit (this includes the purchase of toothpaste).

Checks should be made out to St. Marks with the specification for LWR Quilt and Kit shipping fund. Last year we donated 51 school kits, 6 baby kits, 9 personal care kits, and 4 sewing kits. Let's do more to help our fellow man.
