Pastor's "Lion" Message for August 2024

[God] had opened the door of faith for Gentiles (Acts 14:27)

In the church I attended as a boy there is a stained-glass window depicting a heavy wooden door with no outside handle and Jesus standing there knocking. Many interpret this familiar image as Jesus knocking on the door of people's hearts, hoping they will invite him into their lives as Savior and Lord.

Encouraged and invited by The Small Catechism we Lutherans turn toward a much different interpretation. In his explanation of the third article of the Apostles' Creed Luther teaches:

I believe that in my own under standing or strength I cannot be lieve in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him. But instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, sanctified and kept me in true faith.

When looking at this image then, we believe God the Holy Spirit opens the door for Jesus and invites him into our lives.

God wills and desires Christ to be so much a part of our lives that God does not leave it to chance or to our own whims and desires. Our God always takes the initiative.

In a reading from Acts the Apostle Paul notes that when Gentiles became believers it was (and is) through the ministry of the Holy Spirit, not by forcing faith upon people, but by opening the door and inviting them in.

Many times we Lutherans "Sell short the Holy Spirit". Without the Spirit's ministry and invitation where would we be? On the outside looking in.

We do not need to fear. We do not need to question. God in Christ is with us. No matter we encounter. No Matter what the outcome of the presidential election, in Christ God does not abandon us. Jesus knocks. The Holy Spirit opens the door. And we welcome the God of all creation into our lives for God has already declared us welcome.

These items (or any others you find) may be placed in our red, OCC bin located in the Narthex.



Once again, we celebrated God and country on our front lawn. As the night progressed, more folks joined us for refreshments and fellowship. Sam Robinson entertained more than eighty folks in the Nave with his program of "Disney on Pipes." The fireworks did not disappoint as the evening concluded.

Although there is no cost for any of our street hospitality or for the concert in the nave, we do collect donations on behalf of the United Churches Food Pantry and the Shepherd of the Streets. This year \$280.00 was shared equally by these two programs. The Evangelism and Fellowship Committee thanks the congregation not only for their unwavering support of this event, but to the many members of the congregation that "worked" the event from set-up to clean-up. Without this dedication, our celebration would not have been able to span more than two decades and still be going strong.

Saturday, August 10, 2024: This committee will serve its third Habitat for Humanity luncheon to volunteers working on the Faith Build on Scott Street in Williamsport.

Cereal Sundays

For food insecure families with children, there is no vacation from hunger during the summer months. We can help ease that burden. In addition to non-perishable food items being donated to the United Churches Food Pantry, the Evangelism and Fellowship Committee is designating the second Sunday of each summer month to collecting boxes of cereal of any kind and in any size. At this time, the Pantry is in particular need of single-serving containers of cereal.

Our next Cereal Sunday is August 11, 2024.

Can we beat our July collection of 72 boxes of cereal?

Ongoing Collections at St. Mark's:

- Sojourner Truth Ministries (STM): Brown lunch bags, jars of mayo and Dawn dish detergent. FYI: STM serves more than 600 meals each week that include both eat-in and brown bag lunches to qo.
- Blessing Boxes at New Covenant UCC: Monetary donations toward the cost of preparing 80 96 sandwiches per month are greatly appreciated. Checks may be made payable to St. Mark's with the memo line indicating Parish Life. Also needed are easily prepared foods like Cup of Soups, individual packs of crackers and cookies, microwave mac & cheese, pop top cans of Chef Boyardee pasta, ramen noodles and individual boxes of cereal. Travel size hygiene items are also needed.
- Blessing Box Needs: The Parish Life and Evangelism and Fellowship Committees are asking for two specific donations this summer. They are Star-Kist Tuna Creations: Deli Style Tuna Salad and Star-Kist Chicken Creations: Chicken Salad. These items do not need refrigeration and resist spoiling due to extreme temperatures. A container is available in the Narthex for these specific items.

United Churches Food Pantry: Needed are canned vegetables, pasta of all kinds,

cans of soup and jars of peanut butter and jelly. Also see the information concerning Cereal Sunday, August 11, 2024.





Shepherd of the Streets: Needed for men and women are Shampoo and Conditioner, Shaving Cream, Toothbrushes, Toothpaste, Body Wash, Paper

Towels, Toilet Tissue, Deodorant and small packages of Laundry Pods. Feminine hygiene items for women and girls are also needed.

Donations to Sojourner Truth Ministries, the Food Panty, Shepherd of the Streets or the Blessing Boxes may be placed on the tables in the Narthex closet.

Daniel's Closet: This month's clothing drop-off at Redeemer is Thursday, August 22, 2024 from 4:00 PM – 6:00 PM. Light-weight clothing is still being accepted.

- Distribution of free clothing is Saturday, August 24, 2024 from 8:30 AM- 11:00 AM. In addition to clean clothing in good condition, shoes for men, women and children are always needed. Sheets, blankets, throws and afghans are also accepted.
 - If you have a large quantity of clothing, please call Redeemer's office (leave a message) at 570-322-2333 to make an appointment. Smaller quantities of clothing may be placed on the stage if you are unable to accommodate the drop off date.

Sunday School Resumes September 15





August 6th at 6 p.m.

at the Yasui Peace Tower on the corner of Pine Street and Little League Blvd to mark the Hiroshima and Nagasaki bombings in 1945

Dr. Robert S. Yasui commissioned the Peace Tower in the mid-1980s. He hoped that it would provide a place of meditation for the community, a place where those struggling with obstacles in their life might find rest. If you happen to find yourself in the area, listen for the beautiful chimes that play. At night, the Tower is well lit and seems to beckon you to come and take a minute to reflect on the bench that surrounds it. The plaque on the Tower reads, "Dedicated...to the humanity that makes us all one."

From August 6th to the 9th, 1945, more than 200,000 people of Hiroshima and Nagasaki lay dead from the use of the first atomic bombs. Since August 1945, many thousands more have died, and continue to die, from the radioactive fallout of the bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

Bishop Eaton Addresses Political Violence

For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us (Ephesians 2:14).

Just a few weeks ago in my June column for *Living Lutheran* I wrote, "I can't think of an election cycle more fraught and divisive than this one. People all across the political spectrum claim that life as we know it is on the line. It's not possible to agree to disagree—one must decide and put a stake in the ground. There is the potential for violence." That potential is now a reality after last weekend's shooting at a Trump campaign rally that killed Corey D. Comperatore and injured other attendees. I am thankful that former President Trump's injury was minor and pray for his recovery alongside those affected.

I also wrote, "But division and violence don't have to be our inevitable future." I believe this and that God calls this church to say a definitive "no" to political violence now and in the future. Political violence has a long history but no place in democracy. This church belongs to God, and our unity in Christ is a grace-filled and healing gift in a fractured society. As the ELCA we have theological and community resources to meet this moment through worship, discipleship and civic engagement.

In the face of violence, God's resolve for peace in human communities is unshakable. In proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ's forgiveness, healing and new life, the church addresses the ultimate root of violence. God calls us as church together in this moment to hear and embody this good news by embracing our identity as peacemakers through active civic engagement grounded in our baptismal identity and our institutional witness to foster justice, racial and social equity, reconciliation, and healing with compassion and imagination.

Last weekend's shooting has distressed and destabilized our nation. Political violence breeds fear and can set in motion cycles of violence that will further shatter us. Consider how, as individuals and communities in our life together, you will:

- Confess and confront the violent tendencies within ourselves and our society.
- Resist use of dehumanizing language about people with different political leanings.
- Build bridges of curiosity and compassion with people who think differently.
- Find ways to cultivate the practices of nonviolence in civic life.

Our inevitable future belongs to God. In this certainty and bound together in Christian hope, consider how you can join me in ongoing prayer and actions for our nation, a peaceful election season, the safety of candidates for office, and a bold and life-giving witness of our church in the time ahead.


