Pastor's "Lion" Message for September

Whatever work you do, put yourselves into it, as done for the Lord... Colossians 3:23

On Monday, September 2, our nation celebrates Labor Day. Labor Day was established as a federal holiday in 1894. Its purpose was to recognize and organize the rights of American workers.

ELCA Lutherans believe that work is a way we serve God and our neighbor. Taking our cue from Scripture, we see work as the means through which basic needs are met as we who are created in God's image are called to till and keep God's garden (Genesis 2:15). Thus work is seen not as an end in itself but as a means for sustaining community and creation.

Labor Day, like many holidays marks the passage of time:

Change of weather

Back to school

The end of the growing season

A return to a more structured and for some a more challenging schedule

Labor Day brings change.

It also reminds us of the steadfastness of our God. Our heavenly Father through Christ keeps promises. Weather changes. Vacations end. Harvest replaces sowing and tilling. Society returns to a more hurried existence. But God remains the same. Though all things around us change, "Jesus Christ remains the same, yesterday and today and forever (Hebrews 13:8)".

Labor Day then not only represents a change but also a new commitment; a return to our "Laboring for the Lord". Whatever work we do we should see it as been done for God and for the good of others. Our work, our tasks in life are an extension of our faith. For too long we have defined life as faith or works. 

Camp Mount Luther "Foundations for the Future" Capital Campaign



Last April Bishop Collins joined both of our church services and gave an energizing account of the importance Camp Mount Luther plays in the spiritual growth of not only our children, but of families and community members as well. After 60 years of use, however, there is a definite need to modernize its facilities. In an effort to do this, the Upper Susquehanna Synod is conducting a Capital Campaign to help raise the needed \$1.6 to \$2 million to be used to renovate Maple Hall and build a new bathhouse. St. Mark's Church Council feels strongly that supporting Camp Mount Luther and the "Foundations for the Future" campaign is worthwhile, and a campaign target goal of contributing \$7500.00 over the next three years has been set. Over

the course of the next several weeks, information regarding the capital campaign will be distributed and discussed. On Sunday, September 22 you will have an opportunity to join in this effort by making your commitment to the campaign. We ask that you prayerfully consider your response as we join together to reach our congregational goal. The other 75% is distributed by Church World Service nationally and internationally to help people who are hungry.

The United Churches of Lycoming County's Food Pantry is seeing an increase in families that are utilizing our services in order to stretch their limited resources. We love being able to feed our neighbors, with your donations, and with the love of Christ! However, our shelves are becoming empty as soon as we fill them. Please consider taking a collection, within your church of our most needed items:

- Canned Meats (Tuna Fish, Chicken, Salmon, Beef, etc.)
- Canned Fruits (Peaches, Mandarin Oranges, Pineapple, Pears, etc.)
- Canned Vegetables (Carrots especially!)
- Pastas (Elbow Macaroni, Wide Egg Noodles, etc.)
- Soups (Cream of Chicken, Cream of Mushroom, Beef Stew, Chunky Soups, Ramen Noodles, etc.)

We have been told that the use of the Blessing Boxes by homeless and low-income people has greatly increased. Thank you for helping us help others.

<u>The Red Cross Blood Drive</u> held on August 2, 2024 was a success. Twenty-two pints of blood were donated with our own Karen Mariano and Wanda Fortin being donors. Our next blood drive will be December 6, 2024.

<u>Habitat for Humanity Luncheons</u> will resume this fall. Our committee will be contacted with available dates later in September. Please consider donating a food item or joining us in serving the volunteers.
