Desk

On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed 95 theses to the door of the Wittenburg Castle Church in Wittenburg, Germany. This action by a monk and professor of theology was intended to invite the church to debate practices which seemed to not uphold scripture. Instead, it led to mounting protests against the church establishment. In time this rift became so great that it gave birth to the "re-formation" of a new church movement.

That was more than 500 years ago, why bother with such historical details today? Won't the "celebration" of such an act (which is what we Lutherans do every October 31 or the Sunday closest to October 31) cause more division in the body of Christ? We remember and celebrate Reformation Day not to cause more division, but to call us as the church to always seek to reform for the cause of Christ. Reformation literally means, "change for the better" and as such reminds us to seek to walk in the ways of of the Holy Spirit. Reformation should never be seen as being done and over.

With that in mind, I pose a question, What might happen if we were to observe every day as a personal *Reformation Day*? To engage in such an activity might just encourage us to take even more seriously our reading of Romans 3:19-28. <u>All</u> have fallen short, therefore <u>all</u> need to turn to God and acknowledge we need God's help in living life. We all need God's help in changing for the better!

You and I cannot follow God's laws perfectly. Like it or not we are all considered lawbreakers. But in the midst of all our law breaking stands our loving and forgiving God. God is our welcoming "Mighty Fortress" (to quote Luther) ever alert and attending to our unspoken needs. No matter who, where or how we are today, each of us can change for the better. How, by our own means? No, by God's grace; by embracing the One who stands ready to forgive and call us to embrace and follow a new direction.






