



On Thursday, November 28, our nation will observe a National Day of Thanksgiving. Thanksgiving Day in the USA is a federal holiday commemorating the giving of thanks of Pilgrims and Native Americans at their first harvest in Plymouth, Massachusetts, November, 1621. This feast lasted three days and was attended by 90 Native American Wampanoag people and 53 survivors of the Mayflower (Pilgrims).

Thanksgiving Day has been celebrated nationally on and off since 1789. It is truly the first uniquely "American holiday."

Keeping with the spirit of thanksgiving I share with you the words of the hymn We Plow the Fields and Scatter as my Lion Pastor's Page for November. May these words inspire all of us to remember to give thanks for all we enjoy! Happy Thanksgiving! +Pastor Vasey



- Committee continues to provide sandwiches for the Blessing Box at New Covenant UCC.
- Personal care products will be collected for Shepherd of the Street during a
 - "mini hygiene drive" November 10-24, 2024.
- Parish Life, along with volunteers, will help with 2 funeral luncheons in October.

Faith Formation: Update provided by Vicki Haussmann.

- October Bible Study on the book of Galatians has had 12-14 in attendance.
- OCC shoebox packing November 17, 2024.

Finance: Update provided by Debra Buckman.

- Working on 2025 budget proposal.

- Stewardship Sunday will be November 3, 2024. Pledge cards will be available in the Narthex as well as in The Lion.
- Herb Poff mailed 70 contribution statements to members of the congregation.

Little Lambs: Update provided by Pastor Vasey.

- The official name of Little Lambs is Little Lambs Preschool and Childcare, Inc.
- Time was spent reviewing the proposed lease. Gary Weber will review.
- There is a discrepancy in our ledgers as to how much rent has been paid to St. Mark's this year. This is being worked on and will be rectified as soon as possible.
- Should there be an emergency in the Little Lambs area of the building on a day they are not in session, please give them notice.
- Harvest Party will be October 31, 2024 at 9:30 AM. Please feel free to come see the kids parade in their costumes!

Nominating: Update provided by Ralph Zeigler.

- Committee met before council meeting and identified possible persons to serve on church council in 2025. 2 of the 4 vacant council positions have accepted nominations.

The committee will be reaching out to other candidates in the near future.

- Joe Bauer, Administrative Assistant, has been admitted to the hospital with pneumonia.

- Parish House roof estimate received at \$205,000. Requests for bids will be obtained.
- Little Lambs shared a 10/9/24 inspection report from the City Fire Department noting several deficiencies: lighted exit signs are not working, working emergency lighting in halls and stairways needed, properly installed and working smoke detectors are needed. A new emergency generator will be considered as well.
 - * This issue, and the pressing need to address some of these deficiencies has been moved to the top of the To Do List.
 - * The question was broached and a short discussion had as to what do we want to do with the Parish House moving forward? No decisions were made at this point in time and future
- discus sion will need to take place. As of now, Parish House repairs will continue to be addressed and properly cared for.

Hygiene Help for the Shepherd of the Streets

The Evangelism and Fellowship Committee has received several requests from the Shepherd's office asking for assistance with hygiene products for men, women and children. Yvonne Shenuski, Administrative Assistant, states that as soon as items are received, they are distributed. In response to this urgent need, this committee will be conducting a mini hygiene product collection beginning November 10. We will be distributing small grocery bags to congregation members on that Sunday. Please consider donating something from your own bathroom closet or including an item or two on your shopping list. Dollar Tree, Dollar General and Family Dollar are all sources of good products at reasonable prices. We are requesting that all bags be returned by Sunday, November 24. Our donations will be delivered to the Shepherd of the Streets office on Monday, November 25. Thank you for any help you can give.

Ongoing Collections at St. Mark's:

- <u>Card Ministry:</u> Thank you, Nikki Jackson for sending cards in October. During November Vicki Haussmann will send cards to those we do not see as often as we would like.
- **2025 Calendars and Planners:** If you are already receiving these items and have extras, please consider donating them for distribution to places like Daniel's Closet, Blessing Boxes and Shepherd of the Streets. A box is in the Narthex Closet for your donations.
- <u>Sojourner Truth Ministries (STM)</u>: Needed are brown, large-size lunch bags, plastic wrap, bottles of salad dressing (any kind,) ketchup and mustard. FYI: STM serves more than **600** meals each week that include both eat-in and brown bag lunches to go.
